**77/09 Apologies for Absence**

There were no apologies for absence.

**78/09 Minutes of Last Meeting: Wednesday, 2 September 2009**

**79/09 Matters Arising**

The Chairman proposed that this item be deferred to the next scheduled meeting and this proposal was seconded and CARRIED.

**80/09 Public Question Time**

**81/09 Public Speaking Time**

**82/09 Declarations of Interest**

There were no declarations of interest.

**83/09 Corn Exchange**

Members were asked to consider a request from the Venues Committee to release money to purchase two new replacement boilers urgently required for the Corn Exchange.

Cllr D Price, Chairman of the Venues Committee, explained that these two new boilers were required urgently as the winter heating was due to be switched on in October.

Quotes had been received and considered in detail by the Venues Committee and the Committee now recommended that the quote from Gas Care be accepted in the sum of £11,600 + VAT for the installation of 2 x Vaillant Commercial, wall/frame mounted

65kw, high efficiency, condensing boilers with installation of 2 new vertical flues, plus independent control.

However, as the Venues Committee had no budget for this proposed purchase, a request for the money was now being submitted to the Finance & Audit Committee as a matter of urgency.

A list drawn up by the Town Clerk detailing reserve funded items to date was tabled and considered. Following discussion, it was proposed seconded and CARRIED that the sum of £11,500 + VAT be made available from reserves for the purchase of the above boilers and that under the terms of the signed Agreement for the transfer of ownership of the Corn Exchange to the Town Council, a claim for this amount would be made to the Vale of White Horse District Council.
