

## Sally's Meeting Summary

# Planning and Highways 25th April

A resident asked for disabled parking outside the Friends Meeting House on Lechlade Road. This can be requested directly by residents from Oxfordshire County Council.

9 planning applications were considered.

Strong objections were registered against: P21/V0576/O (Outline) Major. Amendment: No. 2 Outline application for access only for the erection of 25 dwellings with open space and associated infrastructure. Address: Land at Fernham Road Faringdon, on the grounds of concerns regarding:

Drainage, flood risk, concerns regarding trees and biodiversity, pedestrian and cycle links and traffic congestion on the narrow Fernham Road.

A response to the complaint regarding the planning permission granted at Rogers Concrete, Sandshill, Faringdon. Planning application: P20/V0855/O was received. Members were unhappy with the response where the complaint was not upheld. It was agreed that a recommendation be made to Full Council that this complaint move to next stage.

Concern was raised regarding the lack of connecting footpaths between housing estates. The councillors felt it was important these were facilitated at an early stage in planning. The Clerk will book an online appointment with the new District Council planning Q&A sessions to ask how this can be achieved.

Cllr. Bentley was elected as Mayor and Cllr. Liz Swallow elected as Deputy Mayor for 2022/23.
