# Full Council Monday 11th April

**Community Infrastructure Levy** – a grant of £9,000 was made to Faringdon Football Club as a contribution towards costs of new mowing equipment.

Members received notification of CIL funds released to a total of £163,381.57. To ensure the money is spent in line with community need a discussion of FTC's values, focus and ambitions would be held at the next Strategic Working Party Meeting being held on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> May.

**Street Names** for phase two of the land south of Park Rd development would be chosen from the

War Memorial, as well as a suggestion from a resident to honour former mayor Gwen Brickell.

**Nursery Provision Consultation** Members discussed letter from Faringdon Learning Trust regarding a consultation on the provision of new nursery places at the new Folly View Primary School. Before commenting they will ask for further clarification on the provision of nursery places in relation to primary intake.

FTC will take on the management of the **Faringdon Food Bank** and work in partnership with Churches Together on the operation of this much- needed service which is open Mon and Wed 10am to 12pm, in the Council offices.

It was agreed the Town Council proactively seek to achieve improvement in **cleanliness of the streets** in and around the Market Square, by liaising with VWHDC and OCC, encouraging residents and businesses, and raising awareness through publicity. This would be discussed further at the Town Meeting on May 18<sup>th</sup> 2022.

### Facilities Committee Monday 4th April

**Energy Audit** - Quotes for changing all lights in the Corn Exchange and in the Pump House to LED are being sought. A partnership agreement with the **Friends of the Wilderness** was agreed

**Faringdon Art Society** were given a special hire rate for their exhibition in the Corn Exchange in October 2022.

**Town PA System** - a recommendation to purchase a system would be made to the Finance Committee along with the quotes.

**Live Music in the Corn Exchange** A pilot event will be organised, in consultation with local residents. It was also agreed that the recommendations made by Cllr Castle, including the possibility of soundproof curtains, be further investigated.

**Town Centre Planting** A plan will be drafted for more planters with full costings and maintenance plan for consideration at the next meeting. Bulbs will be planted in Town Park. Cllr. Swallow will visit areas owned by the District Council and discuss possible planting in these locations.

**New tables** are to be purchased for the Pump House from an earmarked reserve allocated for this purpose.

A new **Town Park** Working Party be created, in order to draft a plan to regenerate the park.

An audit of current **noticeboards**, followed by a plan for new boards and possible new locations with costings will be drafted for the next meeting.

A metal **Pink Pigeon recycling bin** will be sited Southampton Street Car Park

**Eagles Park** A recommendation to install a boules court in the park will be taken to the Finance Committee.

## Community and Partnerships Committee Wed 30th March

A **youth grant** of £3,000 for Be Free Young Carers, was agreed

FTC will support the next **record fair** on 7th May in the Old Town Hall.

Markets - FTC will continue to administer stalls on a Saturday and support the current management of the Tuesday market. It was agreed the council do not have capacity to organise further events but the community should be encouraged to get involved.

**Community Arts** -Draft plans for an artistic bench trail were received and a 'Faringdon Quarters' division for the trail themes was approved. The faringdon artistic bollards will be launched on 14<sup>th</sup> May in the Town Centre at 11am.

**Community Larder** – A massive 2.5 tons of fruit and vegetables have been saved from landfill since the larder started last year.

Art Weeks - A children's art exhibition in May 2023 in partnership with Art Weeks, potentially in the Corn Exchange, would be investigated by Cllr. Morgan. ## Planning & Highways committee Wed 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2022

7 **Planning Applications** were considered.

Applications for the FAZE and Infant School sites have been submitted to be registered as 'Assets of Community Value.' If accepted the community will be given the time to put in an offer to purchase them.

**Welcome Signs** - Builders Ede will contribute £1200 towards the cost of gateway signs to Faringdon following the removal of the welcome wall when Stickley Court was built.

**Fernham Road Footpath** - The owners of a 'ransom strip' that is preventing a footpath from the Fernham Fields Estate

to Fernham Rd will give permission for the footpath. OCC will consider paying for putting in the footpath if FTC pay the legal fees, estimated to be £1600, which was agreed. Members commented that footpaths such as this should not be paid for by the taxpayer in this way and there is a need for the District Council to anticipate paths being necessary on new developments.
