Planning and Highways 24th July 2023

Two further emails were received from local residents raising concerns about the dangers of crossing the A420 and turning out onto it at the Great Coxwell turn. These concerns will be forwarded to the Highway Authority via the Faringdon Traffic Advisory committee. Faringdon Town Council (FTC) continue to remain concerned about A420 safety and urge members of public who are worried about this issue to contact us by email office@faringdontowncouncil.gov.uk and we will forward your concerns. An application for a proposed development on the Wicklesham Quarry site has been withdrawn. The committee discussed and agreed several points to be made to the developer should they resubmit the application.

<u>Planning and Highways 21st August 2023</u> The committee considered 6 applications with no objections recorded. Comments can be found on our website.

It was agreed to proceed with an application to register the current **police station as an asset of community value.** If successful, this means that if the police station is sold, FTC will have an opportunity to formulate a community bid to retain the space as an asset.

An application to Vale of White Horse District Council (VoWH) to release s106 funding to VoWH Leisure Facilities Team for the provision of an **artificial turf pitch**, perimeter fencing and floodlighting at Faringdon Leisure Centre/

Faringdon Community College is supported. However, the committee wanted it noted there must be a condition that the facility is a community asset, not just for leisure centre and school use. It must be available at a concessionary and affordable rate for local sports clubs and community members.

September Artist of the month



Faringdon Information Centre is delighted to have Karen Vogt as our Artist of the month for September. Karen works in stone and clay as people have done since prehistoric times,

enjoying the connection to the earth and its ancient beauty. Using simple hand building techniques and basic tools, she concentrates on form rather than colour or surface decoration and draws her inspiration from organic forms in nature, the human body and the local landscape. Her artworks can be seen around the town: bollards ('Green Faringdon' and 'Beneath



our Feet'); the circular noticeboard round the tree in the Market Place, celebrating the Folly woodland and tower and the four stone gatepost finials at the entrance to Folly Park View, based on fossils for which Faringdon is world-famous. She is a long-standing member of Faringdon Art Society and currently holds the cup for 'Best in Show' at their annual exhibition. She opens her studio in Great Coxwell every May for Oxfordshire Artweeks. To see Karen's work stop by the Information Centre throughout September, we are open 9am to 4pm Monday to Friday and 9:30am to 1pm on Saturdays.
