

Sally's Summary Your Town Clerk summarises this month's meetings below. Full meeting minutes are available on our website.

### **Community and Partnerships - 4th September**

The committee were sad to learn Carole Gough is leaving her post as Co-Ordinator at The Place. Carole was thanked for all her wonderful hard work during her time there.

A draft revenue budget of £23,005 for 24.25 was agreed. Councillors will soon be available to meet residents once a quarter at a Tuesday market and on a Saturday morning. New signs have been approved for all bus shelters which will have a QR code linking to the FTC website.

8 new artworks are being installed on bollards in the Market Place in October.

# **Town Council - 11<sup>th</sup> September**

Further concerned resident letters about A420 safety were received. All the concerns will be passed to Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) as the highway's authority.

Objections to a licence application to have street traders outside the Swan Public House were received. The Planning and Highways Committee will consider a response to the licensing authority - Vale of White Horse District Council (VoWHDC) at their meeting on 25th September 2023.

Broadband has now been installed in the Old Town Hall following a grant from OCC and will be available free of charge in a few weeks to hirers of the facility.

A report on the upsurge in Anti-Social Behaviour in Faringdon was received. Successful measures have been taken to reduce incidents. The neighbourhood police team were thanked for their efforts.

Faringdon Tourist Bus - the new service has been a very well received project. A meeting will be called once all the data for the project has been received, to determine the next steps for the bus and consider extending the pilot scheme.

#### **Amenity Land in Faringdon:**

- The FAZE site which will likely be declared as surplus by OCC and sold. If this happens FTC will consider all
- The Infant School site which will become a special educational needs and disability (SEND) School.
- Several options were being investigated to site a multiuse games area. It was noted that land was available for sale on London Street. The clerk will do a feasibility study on the purchase for community use. NB this land has now been sold to a private buyer.

Members considered a recent decision by the dental practice in Faringdon to cease NHS provision. The clerk will write a letter to the practice and the local MP, David Johnston, to express disappointment and concern about this decision.

The rise of numbers at Faringdon medical practice was discussed. The chair explained that he regularly received complaints from residents regarding difficulties in getting appointments.

Wessex Leisure Developer Funding – The council considered notes of a meeting with VoWHDC to discuss reallocation of funds allocated to a leisure centre in Wantage, which will no longer go ahead. The clerk will continue to investigate possibilities for the use of this money and report suggestions and findings to the council so they can be put forward to VoWHDC who are the responsible body.

# Facilities Committee - 18th September

A trainee Forest School tutor was given permission to run six sessions of Forest School in the Wilderness starting late September.

**New LED lighting in the Corn Exchange** has been completed. Contractors continue to use the Highworth Road layby, without permission, preventing people from parking there for the view, causing significant wear and tear to the surface and creating extra work for the FTC maintenance team.

New town centre planters and re-located planters will be planted up for the autumn in October.

Solar panels on the roof of the old theatre at the Pump House will be investigated and quotes obtained.

The installation of a **defibrillator** will be investigated in the Old Telephone Box on Canada Lane


