

Finance notes - 2024/25

- Precept for 2024/25 = £535,283 = £159.43 per Band D household.
- Maintenance costs (general repairs) have increased.
- Prioritised routine maintenance raised in building condition reports is being pursued as recommended.
- Tourist Information Centre and Cinema continue to be valued by the community.
- Office & Establishment costs under budget. (Value for money and good financial administration continue be practised).



Precept/Budget 2025/26 challenges

- Challenges keeping on top of routine asset maintenance using revenue.
- 3 year budgeting will help to manage workflow and use of Earmarked Reserves/grants for capital expenditure.
- Objective to keep precept/budget below rate of inflation (4%).
- Demand for improved community facilities in FTC's parks and venues.
- Rising energy bills.
- Evolving legal obligations around health and safety, fire risk and safeguarding.
